PSHE Overview



Subject Leadership

Mrs Lovatt is the PSHE subject lead. PSHE is covered throughout many curriculum areas.

EYFS

PSED is covered throughout the day through all areas of the curriculum. There is a strong focus on making friends, sharing and taking turns and identifying different emotions.

Key Stage One

Pupils in Key Stage One continue to focus on positive friendships. They begin to look at feeling special and what makes them unique. There is a strong focus on staying safe and safety networks.

Key Stage Two

PSHE is further developed through a more detailed focus on the importance of what staying safe means, feelings associated with this and who to ask for help. Learning also focuses on risk-taking.

Assessment

Assessment takes place through observations of pupils' discussions in lessons and theme weeks. It also takes place through circle time sessions.

Progression

Progression is developed through following the PSHE learning outcomes which are split into the three key themes: Health and Wellbeing, Relationships and Living in the Wider World.

Enrichment

Pupils benefit from visits and visitors which enhance learning and develop their skills for life. This provides opportunities to make links with the wider community.

Pupil Voice

Pupils are encouraged to voice their opinion of school life through an annual questionnaire and School Council meetings with Mrs Reece.

Parent Voice

Parents are invited into school to explore theme days and weeks with their children during Anti-Bullying Week, Safer Internet Day and Careers Week.
