Mathematics



Year 5 will be reading 'Children of Winter' by Berlie Doherty, which chronicles the survival of three siblings during the Great Plague of 1666. They will recount parts of the story from the perspective of key characters and continue to develop their sentence structures. When reading, the children will be focusing on inference skills and using text analysis to examine the author's choice of vocabulary and character development.

During the term, the children will:

- Use a formal written method to add and subtract decimal numbers.
- Compare, order and measure angles using degrees.
- Use a protractor to accurately draw angles.
- Calculate angles on a straight line.
- Translate a shape and position in the first quadrant using coordinates.
- Identify lines of symmetry and complete a symmetric figure.
- Convert measurements using imperial and metric units.

This term, the children will be learning about Properties and Changes of Materials', including:

- Everyday materials and their properties and their response to magnets.
- Comparing and grouping materials based on their thermal conductivity.
- Investigating which materials are the best electrical conductors.
- Which materials will dissolve in liquid to form a solution and grouping them together on the basis of their solubility.

In History, the children will learn the following about the Anglo Saxons and Vikings:

- How Britain changed during the Saxon invasion.
- Who the Vikings were and where they came from.
- Viking raids, invasions and settlements.
- How different sources and evidence influence our understanding of the Vikings.
- The legal system in Anglo-Saxon Britain and how it compares to the modern legal system in Britain.




Science

Foundation
