If you require any further information about your child's learning, please speak to any member of the Year 4 team.

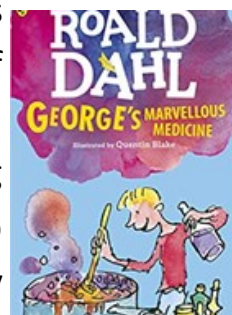

Year 4 Staff

English

Our learning will be based around the text 'George's Marvellous Medicine', by Roald Dahl, which follows the misadventures of George in attempting to create a medicine to make his Grandma a nicer person. The children will recount parts of the story using ambitious vocabulary. When reading, the children will develop inference skills and focus on the effect of an author's vocabulary choices.



Mathematics

During the term, the children will:

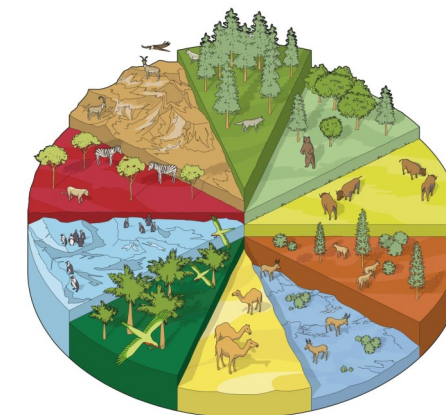
- ♦ Read and represent numbers to 1,000.
- ♦ Round whole numbers to the nearest 10 and 100.
- ♦ Count in 1,000s.
- ♦ Partition numbers to 1,000.
- ♦ Compare numbers to 1,000.
- ♦ Add and subtract 3 and 4-digit numbers.
- ♦ Solve problems involving perimeter and area.
- ♦ Multiply and divide numbers.



Science

Our Science learning will focus on living things and their habitats, including:

- ♦ Grouping living things in a variety of ways.
- ♦ Using classification keys to identify living things.
- ♦ Exploring how environments can change.
- ♦ The dangers posed by environments changing.
- ♦ Creating classification keys to identify animals.



Foundation Subjects

During our learning about America, the children will:

- ♦ Use an atlas to locate the countries and regions in the Americas.
- ♦ Describe and understand the different layers of vegetation in a rainforest.
- ♦ Learn about the animals which live in the rainforests.
- ♦ Discover facts about the Mayan civilisation.
- ♦ Learn about some Maya gods.



Personal, Social, Religious and Emotional Development



In Religious Education, the children will be exploring the question 'What do Hindus believe God is like?' to understand how Hindus show their faith. They will also be learning about the 'Trinity' and why it is important for Christians.

During PSHE lessons, the children will learn about positive friendships, how to respond to hurtful behaviour (including when online) and the importance of respecting similarities and differences.

PE

During PE lessons, the children will be learning the skills and techniques needed to play a range of invasion games. They will use a variety of simple tactics for attacking and keeping possession of the ball as a team. They will begin to understand that they need to defend as well as attack.
