If you require any further information about your child's learning, please speak to any member of the Year 3 team.

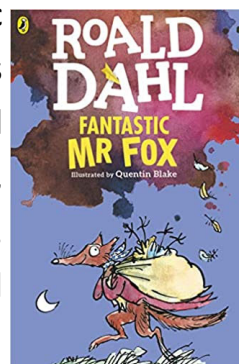

English

Our learning in English will be based around the book 'Fantastic Mr Fox' by Roald Dahl which focuses on a fox who resorts to his natural craftiness to rise above the opposition faced by local farmers. After they have familiarised themselves with the story, the children will write a recount of the key events of each chapter. When reading, the children will develop their inference skills and focus on the effect of vocabulary choices.



Mathematics

During the half term, the children will:

- ♦ Multiply and divide two-digit numbers by a one-digit number.
- ♦ Measure and compare lengths.
- ♦ Measure and compare the perimeters of shapes.
- ♦ Recognise and calculate with fractions.
- ♦ Order fractions from greatest to smallest.
- ♦ Measure and compare mass and capacity.



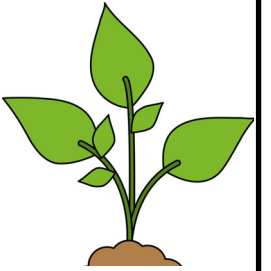
Science

As part of our learning about animals including humans, the children will:

- ♦ Identify that animals and humans need the right types and amount of nutrition and that they cannot make their own food.
- ♦ Identify that humans and some other animals have skeletons and muscles for support, protection and movement.

During our learning about plants, the children will:

- ♦ Identify and describe the functions of the parts of a plant.
- ♦ Investigate the way water is transported in plants.
- ♦ Explore the life cycle of flowering plants.



Creative Curriculum

Our learning this term focuses on caring for the environment and planet Earth. The children will:

- ♦ Explore the geographical features of the Earth, including the distribution of natural resources.
- ♦ Identify the position and significance of latitude, longitude and the equator.
- ♦ Learn about the different layers which make up the Earth.



Personal, Social, Religious and Emotional Development



In Religious Education, the children will be considering two questions: 'What is it like for someone to follow God?' and 'How do festivals and worship show what matters to a Muslim?'

In PSHE, the children will explore the value of rules and laws, rights, freedom and responsibilities. They will also learn how to stay safe when using the Internet.

PE

During PE lessons, the children will develop their dancing skills, working together to choreograph a dance.

In the second half of the term, the children will be learning the skills and techniques needed to play a range of invasion games, knowing and using rules fairly to keep games going.
