Year 1 Staff

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Our learning will be based around the text 'The Tiger Who The Tiger Who Came to Tea' by Judith Kerr, a story about an unexpected visitor during tea time. The children will write their own version of the story, writing an alternative ending. During reading lessons, the children will develop their retrieval skills by finding answers in the text as well as learning to read with expression.



During the term, the children will:

- Read, write and interpret mathematical statements.
- Recognise and name common 2D and 3D shapes.
- Read and write numbers from 1 to 20 in numerals and words.
- Recognise and know the value of different denominations of coins and notes.
- Solve one-step problems that involve addition, subtraction, multiplication and division.
- Describe position, direction and movement, including whole, half, quarter and three-quarter turns.

Our science learning will focus on the topic 'Plants'.

The children will learn:

- To identify a few wild and garden plants.
- To identify deciduous and evergreen trees.
- To identify and describe the basic structure of some common flowering plants and trees.
- What a plant needs in order to grow.



During our topic, 'The Great Fire of London', the children will learn about: The timeline of events that caused the fire.

- Samuel Pepys's diary and his recount about what happened.
- Why the fire spread so far.
- What London used to look like and how it has changed over time.



Personal, Social

Foundation Subjects

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In Religious Education, the children will be exploring 'Who is Jewish and how do they live?' and 'How should we care for the world and for others, and why does it matter?'

In PSHE, the children will learn about health and wellbeing. The children will learn about what their bodies need to be healthy and how rules and restrictions keep us safe online.

During PE lessons, the children will develop their athletic skills and try to beat their personal bests in running, speed, strength balance and coordination.
