Our learning will be based around two stories, 'The Gingerbread Man' and 'The Three Bears and Goldilocks' by Jonathan Langley. The children will recount the story from the perspectives of key characters and look at the punctuation needed in a sentence. When reading, the children will develop comprehension skills and focus on locating information in a text to answer questions.

During the term, the children will:

- Sort, count and represent numbers up to 10 using concrete objects.
- Count forwards and backwards saying one more and one less than a number.
- Solve addition and subtraction problems within 10.
- Explore 2D and 3D shapes.
- Look at place value in numbers up to 20.
- Learn about part-whole models.


In PSHE, the children will learn about families and friendships and the roles that different people have. They will explore safe relationships, how their behaviour affects others and why they should be polite and respectful.
