

Mathematics

Our learning will be based around the text 'The Wind in the Willows', by Kenneth Grahame, which focuses on four great friends (Toad, Mole, Rat and Badger) and their adventures in the countryside. The children will recount parts of the story from the perspectives of key characters from within the text. When reading, the children will develop their inference skills and focus on the effect of the author's vocabulary choices.



During the term, the children will focus on:

- Writing, rounding and ordering numbers to at least 1,000,000.
- Finding common multiples and factors of numbers.
- Identifying prime, square and cube numbers.
- Multiplying and dividing numbers by 10, 100 and 1,000.
- Securing written methods for addition and subtraction.
- Converting mixed numbers and improper fractions.



n Science, Year 5 will be learning about:

- The seven life processes of all living things.
- The five animal groups and the different ways in which they reproduce.
- The key sexual structures of a flower and its life cycle.
- Ways that plants reproduce asexually and how to grow new plants from a range of parent plant parts.
- Insect and amphibian life cycles and creating life cycle illustrations.



- Examine artefacts and sources to investigate what life was like in Ancient Greece during this period of time.
- Read Greek myths and legends.
