ANTI-BULLYING WEEK ~ 13th to 17th NOVEMBER 2023

Anti-bullying Week begins next week. The whole school will be involved in activities to promote working together to prevent bullying at Holden Lane. Each class will focus on working hard to encourage positive relationships and to spread the anti-bullying message throughout school and our local community.

This year's theme - *Make a noise about bullying* - aims to empower children, staff and families to do something positive to counter the harm and hurt that bullying causes.

Too often, we are silent when we see bullying take place, silent about the hurt bullying causes, and silent when we hear bullying dismissed as 'just banter'. It doesn't have to be this way.

This Anti-Bullying Week, let's come together to have discussions about what bullying means to us, how banter can turn into something more hurtful, and what we can do to stop bullying. Together, we can make a difference and take a stand against bullying.

Throughout the week, our children will be learning to understand what constitutes bullying, where to go for help and how to help others. They will be raising awareness of the effects of bullying on the lives of children both in the short and long term. YEAR 5 SCULPTOR VISIT ~ NEIL WOOD

Well done to our fabulous Year 5 class who were delighted to work with the excellent sculptor Neil Wood before half term. Each child was able to learn about the process of making a relief

sculpture before creating their own.

The children used a range of discarded materials to create images relating to Ancient Greece in a bed of clay. They were given creative freedom with the materials and the clay to create a model which they thought best represented the topic. Casting plaster was then added to their models to create a mould which is known as a relief sculpture.

The children were able to see different sculptures created by Neil and they asked questions about his profession and the artwork itself. They all showed great interest and enthusiasm throughout the day. Well done to our Year 5 historians and sculptors, we are very proud of you all!





YEAR 2 VISIT STANLEY HEAD

Well done to our wonderful Year 2 class who visited Stanley Head Outdoor Education Centre this week to enhance their learning about The Tunnel by Anthony Browne.

The children started their day sitting around a campfire with a cup of warm juice to listen to the story of The Tunnel. Afterwards, they used branches from the woods to build their own tunnels to explore. They then took part in orienteering, using their map skills to find pictures from the book. They used sticks, leaves and natural materials to create a setting picture from the story.

To finish their busy day, they completed an obstacle course involving different tunnels. Everyone took part with great enthusiasm, despite the wind and rain.

They returned to school extremely muddy but very happy and eager to tell us all about their exciting adventures.

<u>STOKE ROCKS ~ TIMES TABLES ROCKSTARS</u>

A huge well done to our Year 5 and Year 6 pupils who took part in the Stoke Rocks Times Tables Rockstars competition before half term. Out of the 42 schools that took part, Holden Lane finished in 19th position. Out of 156 classes, Year 6 were 37th for the number of questions answered correctly amounting to 86,568 questions!
Year 5 were 64th, answering 43,855 questions correctly.
The three highest scorers in Year 5 were Amed, Ikenna and Sufyan.

The three highest scorers in Year 6 were Karan, Logan and Callum. The three highest scorers in each class were awarded a certificate and a medal. In addition, each pupil who finished in the top 10 received a times tables themed



stationery prize.

The next TTRS competition is next week for our Year 4 pupils who will compete against the primary schools in Alpha Academies Trust. Congratulations to our times tables rockstars in Year 5 and Year 6. Good luck to our Year 4 mathematicians for their competition next week!
