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OFSTED INSPECTION REPORT 2024 HOLDEN LANE PRIMARY CONTINUES TO BE GOOD!

The report provides details of the inspection findings and describes areas for future development to further improve our school. We are delighted that Ofsted has judged our school as continuing to be good and we are all incredibly proud of the inspection findings.

with a big heart' where 'pupils perform well in their learning' and
where 'attitudes to learning are highly positive and pupils give their best to all they do'.

We are so proud that the report notes that 'pupils' behaviour is exemplary', and 'pupils are immensely proud of their school and feel

One pupil described the school as a 'happy school, which feels like a family,' which is all we could possibly ask for.

YEAR 3 VISIT APEDALE HERITAGE CENTRE

Year 3 visited Apedale Heritage Centre last week to enrich their learning about the local history of the coal mining industry. The children explored the lost industrial heritage of the Apedale Valley in Newcastle under Lyme.

They took part in a guided tour of an authentic drift mine. The underground tour enabled them to experience the unique atmosphere of a real coal mine that was once the workplace of hundreds of miners. They looked at the mine's workings, found out about the methods used to mine the coal and discovered insights into the working life of a coal miner.

They also visited the museum where they looked at how the local area has been shaped by the coal industry and why the area has such large quantities of coal. They finished the day with a walk in the country park where they looked at the railway and discussed the different ways that coal and pottery have been transported in recent history.

The children learnt a huge amount throughout the experience and showed great interest in their learning.

Well done to our Year 3 local historians — you have made us all proud.

Many thanks to the parents and carers who completed our questionnaires during last term's parent consultation evening. The questionnaires are an important method of gathering information on what is working well and how we can continue to improve our school.

The parent questionnaire results from Spring 2024 show that under the strongly agree category:

90% of parents believe that their child is happy at school. 92% of parents believe that their child feels safe at school.

91% of parents believe that their child makes good progress at the school. 95% of parents believe that their child is well looked after at the school.

90% of parents believe that the school is well led and managed. 92% of parents believe that their child is taught well at the school.

91% of parents stated that they would recommend the school to another parent.
