

Literacy

Mathematics

Our literacy learning will be based around the text 'The Tiger Who Came to Tea' by Judith Kerr. The children will recount the story with a focus on using interesting vocabulary. They will then write their own version of the story by changing the animal and the meal featured in the story. When reading, the children will develop their retrieval skills by highlighting key information in the text and using it to answer questions.



During the half term, the children will:

- Continue to read and write numbers to 100.
- Continue to develop their understanding of place value in numbers up to 100.



- Use additive reasoning to solve problems using addition and subtraction.
- Continue to count forwards and backwards in twos, fives and tens.
- Compare and order length, mass and capacity.
- Compare and sequence intervals of time.
- Use the correct mathematical vocabulary to explain their reasoning.

Our Science learning will focus on plants. During this learning, the children will:

- Label the main parts of a plant and explain their function.
- Observe and describe how seeds and bulbs grow into mature plants.
- Record how the height of a plant changes over time.
- Find out and describe how plants need water, light and a suitable temperature to grow and stay healthy.

Foundation Subjects

Science

During our topic, 'Island Homes', the children will learn about:

- The countries that make up the United Kingdom and their capital cities.
- The weather in the United Kingdom and around the world.
- The physical and human features of a Scottish island.



Personal, Social, igious and Emotion Development




In Religious Education, the children will be exploring the question 'How can we learn from sacred books?'

As part of the 'Dot Com' programme, the children will look at living in the wider world. The children will begin to identify 'British Values' and to explore 'Money and Me' by examining jobs and careers.

PE

During PE lessons, the children will be learning to play invasion games, developing their throwing and catching skills. They will work as part of a team, learning to value the contributions of all members. In athletics lessons, the children will develop their running and jumping skills.



Other Information

Home Learning
