

Literacy

Mathematics

Our learning will be based around the text 'Street Child' by Berlie Doherty which focuses on a young boy's struggle for survival in Victorian Britain. The children will recount parts of the story from the perspectives of key characters from within the text. When reading, the children will develop inference skills and focus on the effect of an author's vocabulary choices.



During the term, the children will:

- Revise place value of numbers to 10,000,000.
- Round numbers to the nearest ten, hundred, thousand and ten thousand.
- Practise written calculation methods.
- Order and compare fractions.
- Use the four operations when calculating with fractions.
- Read and plot co-ordinates in four quadrants.



Our first Science topic will focus on plants and animals, including: Evolution and adaptation to ensure survival of species.

- Inheritance of features.
- What can be learnt from fossils.
- Reasons for the classification of plants and animals.
- As part of their learning about light, the children will:
- Recognise that light appears to travel in straight lines.
- or from light sources to objects and then to our eyes.

During our topic, The Victorians - Reform and Revolution, the children will learn about:

- When the Victorian era was and key events during Queen Victoria's reign.
- The life of children during the Victorian era.
- The work of Doctor Barnardo.
- Victorian inventors and inventions
- Stoke-on-Trent during the Industrial Revolution.


Foundation

In Religious Education, the children will be exploring two key questions: 'Why do Hindus want to be good?' and 'What matters most to Humanists and Christians?'.

During PSHE lessons, the children will learn about relationships, consent in different circumstances, managing pressure and respecting other people's points of view.



During PE lessons, the children will develop the skills and techniques needed to play a range of invasion games, including hockey and handball. They will learn games to invade the opponent's territory while scoring points and keeping the opposing team's points to a minimum.
