

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Mathematics

Our learning will be based around the text 'The Owl Who Was Afraid of The Dark'. After reading the text, the children will use their factual knowledge to write for different purposes, including non-chronological reports and poems.



The children will read and discuss a range of texts, focusing on the vocabulary used, making predictions and retrieving information.

During the term, the children will:

- Learn facts for the 2, 3, 5 and 10 times tables.
- Identify and explain the properties of 2D and 3D shapes.
- Ask and answer questions about data presented in block diagrams, tally charts and pictograms.

- Find fractions of a number.
- Solve reasoning problems, including problems with two steps.





The children will:

Explore and compare the differences between things that are living, dead, and things that have never been alive.






Subjects Foundation

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During our topic about historical people, the children will learn about:
