Despite the blustery weather conditions, Key Stage 2 pupils have been very busy working on their bicycle riding skills this week. Children from Year 4 and Year 5 started their Learn to Ride Bikeability Level 1 training. Our experienced riders from Year 6 began Bikeability Level 2 which builds on their expérience from prévious years.

The training is a national scheme funded by the Department for Transport and provided to schools through Stoke on Trent City Council. The children worked very hard to ride their bikes safely and to demonstrate their new skills. The children who successfully completed the programme were awarded Bikeability badges and certificates.
